### The Majesty of Trees

Friday, April 26 is Arbor Day. This article is a salute to the majesty of trees.

For centuries, people have had a symbiotic relationship with the trees around us. Since ancient times they have provided food, shelter, and warmth. And they have also helped keep the planet healthy.

Let's take a moment to highlight how special trees really are:

- While many trees take 20 to 30 years, some take 40 to 50 years to reach maturity.
- Trees at the equator often mature in 10 to 20 years whereas trees in the northern latitudes can take 80 to 100 years.
- Trees generally live from 20 years to 2000 years with an average of 300 to 400 years.
- A bristlecone pine in Utah is nearly 5000 years old.
- African Blackwood is the rarest and most expensive wood in the world costing \$138 per board foot.

We woodworkers have the privilege of using one of the world's oldest materials. We have a long tradition with this unique material we call wood. Different species have different characteristics, and no two trees are alike. The vibrant colors, grain patterns, and the tactile feel of wood all combine to inspire our creativity.

Over time, most of us develop a sort of reverence for trees and feel an innate connection to nature when we work with wood. A friend suggested that woodworking can be a form of meditation. In the shop, many of us become so engrossed that we forget life's other challenges and totally lose track of time.

The next time you head to the shop as part of our long tradition, take a moment to feel your connection with nature and let your creativity flow.

## Meeting Presentations

### March 2024 Meeting

Kyle Welsing of Welsing Heritage presented a demonstration on hand carving spoons. He got into spoon carving out of an interest in traditional, country woodcraft and green woodworking. One advantage he spoke of was the availability of stock, in the form of branches, and tree trunks: all of which are free! Kyle also spoke about the basic tool kit: an ax, a knife, and a carving gouge. Finally, Kyle stressed the importance of keeping the end user of the product in mind when carving spoons. He recommends not worrying about millimeters or inches. Instead, just use your fingers to determine the width, and your thumb is a quick measure with which to determine where to cut your triangles. In all, Kyle gave a fascinating talk and demonstrated his process throughout the presentation.

## April 2024 Meeting

Scott Roth will present on marquetry techniques in person, at Rockler. Scott is the Inventory Tool Coordinator for Denver Tool Library, where he also teaches Woodworking II: Practical Joinery. He serves as the vice-president of the Rocky Mountain Marquetry Guild. Scott brings woodworking and marquetry knowledge and practice from a lifetime spent in the trades. He has owned a cabinet shop, worked as a licensed remodeling contractor, and taught at numerous universities, including Red Rocks. Scott will show us how, with tools as simple as a straight-line knife for cutting and a simple homemade jig and assembly, you can add decorative embellishments to your woodworking projects.
