General Meeting Minutes

With the aid of slides, Chuck Hunt spoke about his last two summers attending "Anderson Ranch." He also showed slides of the "Woodworking in the Rockies" show and of a real nice Santa Fe home with a lot of woodworking.

Tony Brazzale showed slides from the C.W.G. University Hills Mall show plus a few others of his and other C.W.G. members. He also expressed thanks to Fred and Ken Freimuth for their effort in setting up a fine "Guild" portfolio album.

Fred Freimuth demonstrated and spoke on the sharpening of various types of twist drill bits.

Treasurer Chas. Lennehan mentioned that we still have plenty of C.W.G. T-shirts for sale (\$6.00). He also brought photos he had taken at the Osolonik seminar on woodturning a couple of weeks ago and briefly talked about it.

"Show Committee" chairman Tony Brazzale told about the direction of his committee and the philosophy behind it. They are aiming for a gallery type show. He needs well shot photos of member's works.

Dick Lohner represented the "educational committee." He talked about the great seminar we had on table saw maintenance a few weeks ago at Metro. He also reminded us about the November 13th seminar on marquetry. He also expressed that there was an upcoming workshop on hand dovetailing.

"Tools and Materials Committee" chairman Steve Farnham started collecting money for the abrasives order taken last month. He also took orders for a group purchase of Jorgenson clamps and mentioned his upcoming workshop on the making of wooden planes November 20th.

Host Jim Brandt wrapped up the meeting with a few words about the transition his life in woodworking is going through. He said it was getting more and more commercial and he wasn't happy about that, so he laid off his two employees and is attempting to revert back to finer woodworking.

Minutes from the Board Meeting on 11/11 at Dennis Kercher's house:

The agenda for December's General Meeting at Metro will be a presentation on woodcarving by Michael Fales and improvising a machine cut dovetail jig by Dennis Kercher. Also on the bill are elections of V. Pres. and Secretary. So far Ed. Smith and Ken Friemuth have been nominated for that position. Ed is the incumbent. Len Erickson will write a letter to Bob O'Dell, of Metro, thanking him for the use of Metro's facilities for the table saw maintenance workshop and for the use of Metro for the upcoming Dec. 2nd General Meeting.

Secretary Dennis Kercher will print an extra 10 newsletters monthly to be available to send to prospective members or persons who come to a general meeting and might want to see what our newsletter is, in regards to joining the Guild.

Committee Reports:

Show: Tony Brazzalle, Chairman. Discussion at the board meeting was as follows:

The committee should find and convey information on shows, craft fairs, etc. that might be of interest to the general membership. A request for another mall-type show was made. Also mentioned was the possibility of the Guild having a booth at the Capitol Hill People's Fair. If you're interested in any activities of this type you should contact Tony and voice your ideas. Education:

New Chairman, Dick Lohner. This committee will meet simultaneously with the board meetings. A handcut dovetail workshop with Richard Barsky is scheduled for Jan. 15th. Chairman Dick Lohner expressed that the essence of this Guild is a network of conveying information. 
