### **TC-Woods Field Trip**

I would like to extend a special thank-you to TC Woods for hosting September's field trip. And, to everyone who traveled north to Lafayette for the show, thanks for making this a successful event. For those of you who were unable to attend, you missed out on great demonstrations of logs being milled into boards with three different sawmills.

The demonstrations included Dan O'Dell's Baker stationary bandsaw mill—powered by a 3-phase 10HP electric motor. We also saw two demonstrations of chainsaw powered portable mills run by Andy Zartman. A Logosol mill out of Sweden which has an aluminum frame that supports the log for the milling operation; and an Alaskan sawmill from Canada, which is used for very large logs (up to 56" cut). This sawmill rides up on the log lying on the ground.

Everyone also took time to examine the large stock of air dried wood harvested from our local urban trees that otherwise would go to the landfill, be chipped or split for firewood. #### Don't know about Freedom Pens

The Freedom Pen program is an all volunteer effort spearheaded by the members of SawMill Creek Woodworkers Forums to provide custom hand crafted pens to American servicemen and women overseas. We welcome anyone who is interested in our project and willing to donate their time, talent or services to assist us in our goal of providing beautiful writing instruments for our military stationed in foreign countries who are in harms way.

We believe we can ship over 20,000 pens this year. (*As of October 12<sup>th</sup> 19,252 pens have been donated*) Our target number is relative to the number of woodworkers who are willing to participate. Financial support will be necessary but we can produce hand-crafted pens at a very low cost since all of our labor is a volunteer effort.

Every Freedom Pen that is delivered will serve as a constant reminder to our troops that they are not alone and will have our continued support until every one of them returns home
