We are accepting nominations for these positions. Each candidate nominated will have the opportunity to include a note in the next newsletter. In the newsletter there will be a separate ballot you can mail in or submit at the February meeting. Ballots will be counted and results announced at the February meeting. Nominations and write-ins for candidates are also valid.

If you are not sure you want to sign up to run for a board position we always need help with various aspects of the guild. Web site support, newsletters are the largest monthly items the board generates each month. We also could use help organizing and working on various community projects and outings for guild members.

Section 1.

## ARTICLE III

#### **OFFICERS**

Number. There shall be five (5) officers:

President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Committees at Large.

Section 2. Election, Term of Office. Officers shall be chosen annually by vote of the Guild members. The term for each office shall be two years. The President and Vice President shall be elected in January at the regularly scheduled meetings in even numbered years. The remaining officers shall be elected in January at the regularly scheduled meetings in odd numbered years. This staggering of the Board is for the purpose of guaranteeing at least two officers with experience on the Board at any time. Voting will be by members present, plus absentee ballots received prior to the elections. Officers may serve more than one term.

Section 3. President. The President shall act as a clearinghouse of information and make decisions where the consensus of the members and/or Board of Directors is impractical or inappropriate.

Section 4. Vice President. The Vice President receives establishes the agenda for meetings, runs the meetings according to "Roberts Rules of Order," and assists the President as needed.

**Section 5. Secretary.** The Secretary shall:

- a) Keep the minutes of the meetings in books provided for that purpose.
- b) See that the minutes and all notices are given to the

  Administrative Committee for disbursement.

- See that the records of the Guild are properly kept and filed.
- d) In general, perform all duties incident to the office of

  Secretary and such other duties as, from time-to-time,

  may be assigned by the Board of Directors or by the

  President.

#### **Section 6. Treasurer.** The Treasurer shall:

- Have charge and custody of, and be responsible for,
   all funds and securities of the Guild.
- From time-to-time render a statement of the condition
   of the finances of the Guild at the request of the
   Board of Directors.
- Receive and give receipt for moneys due and payable to the Guild from any source.
- d) Keep records of the membership and, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Treasurer, and such other duties as from time-to-time may be assigned by the Board of Directors or by the President.

# Section 6. Committees at Large. The

Committees at Large Officer shall be in charge of all committees. This

Officer shall be reasonable for forming committees at the direction of the

Board of Directors. This Officer shall monitor and report all progress to
the Board of Directors.

Section 7. Dues For Officers. All members of the Board of Directors shall have their dues waived while serving as an Officer.

I am enclosing the whole letter from Bill to myself as there is no way I could say anything any better then Bill states.

This is a wonderful program, please watch for activities related to making the toys and help.

Enclosed you will find three thank cards along with an email that was distributed to the Jeffco Sheriff's personnel

The largest share of toys went to Safehouse Progressive Alliances for Nonviolence" or SPAN. SPAN provides housing for abused women and children along the front range. Many of the woman and children arrive with only the cloths on their backs. The toys will be placed in playrooms and in some cases given to a child to ease the trauma of being in a secretive environment. I will stay in touch with Byla Farmer. There is an ongoing need for toys and play items.

Ten airplanes went to the Jeffco Christmas Crusade. Andrea Burns called personally to thank the guild for the toys. Yes there is poverty in Jeffco.

Barbara Kemp (Head Start Program) received two cabins, two airplanes and two boats. These toys will be placed at Patterson and Green Mountain Elementary school classrooms for disadvantaged children.

To me there is no greater rewards than to know that somewhere there is a child playing with one of the toys that otherwise might no have received anything for Christmas. The "Thanks You" cards give an added joy to those of us who donated time and skill to make a child's Christmas joy.

Thanks again to all who participated in the program. Also mention that Austin Hardwoods of Denver provided a great selection of off-cuts for many of the projects. Sensational Wood Products provided many pieces of wood, off cuts from commercial door frames, for the grasshopper bodies. John Hammer was gracious enough to pick up and store most of the wood from Sensational Woods for 2005 projects.

I will be willing to help with the toy program in 2005, however at this point I don't know how much time I can devote.
