March's Event Review:

Dennis McCaigue - Violin construction

"When you work on a Strad you have to be extra careful." Not something most of us will ever have to worry about. This from our member Dennis McCaigue who trained for four years in Utah and says he has apprenticed for 20 years. Much of his knowledge comes from the many years of experience building and repairing violins, or fiddles, both names for the same instrument. He has also built violas which are a little bigger than a violin. There are really not a lot of hard and fast rules for construction and a lot of it is by feel gained through his experience.

Before you can start building a violin, you have to build a lot of forms and tools. Many of these tools come from Germany. Most of the tools you buy have to be repaired before use. There are a lot of planes including block, toothing and tiny finger planes. He says there is hardly any other craft that uses as many knives as the violin trade. He has made many sizes and shapes of scrapers from old saw blades. One of the forms is the shape of the interior of the violin and the ribs are bent and assembled around this form. These ribs are thin strips of curly maple which form the sides of the instrument. They are bent on a hot iron using moisture. The back is made from curly maple also and the top is from quarter sawn spruce. The more the grain is perpendicular to the top, the better. The top and back are carved to an arch form which is also very thin. These woods are air dried and the older the better. The top and back plates are glued to the ribs using rabbit glue. There are thin strips called lining that are glued to the inside edges of the ribs to reinforce this glue joint. The finish smoothing is done with scrapers and equisedum, a sort of reed with a scaly texture. Dust in the pores of the wood can deaden the sound.

There are many designs for the scroll carved on the upper end of the neck. These are perfected by each builder. Dennis spoke a little on varnishes and said that may be another program. He said he believed the inside should be finished too and he uses a sizing there. The finish can stifle the sound and many of the old violins have no finish left on them anymore. The color of a finished violin is in the varnish. No stain on the instrument. Dennis says an experienced player

can feel differences of 1/8 of a millimeter. These tiny differences can make large differences in a finished violin.

The oldest violin still in existence is an Andrea Amati and was built in 1564. Dennis has worked on Jack Benny's violin and said he was actually a really good player. There are a lot of imports from China and these are usually student instruments.

Dennis moved here from the west coast, but most of his instruments are brokered in New York. He says it's better to build in a dry climate and ship to a wetter climate, but the reason he lives in Colorado is for the skiing. We are glad to have him here.
