Jeff Tinker will be giving a presentation on the construction of his Maloof style rocking chair that you all saw at the recent Craftsman show. Jeff teaches fine woodworking at Red Rocks Community College and, starting this Fall, will be teaching a class in building this rocking chair.

Sam Maloof's furniture is world renowned. He has been called a national living treasure and the rocking chair is his signature piece. One of his rockers was the first piece of contemporary furniture ever included in the permanent collection at the White House; another is on display at the Boston Museum of Fine Art.

were doing right and what we could do better. Dave Villella spoke about his contact with some other guilds. Participation by members is a big issue at other clubs too. Someone suggested a point system and participation would be rewarded with a banquet. Some of the things we have done in the past and need help with are the Children's Toys Project, Jefferson County Fair and The Craftsman Show.

A suggestion for future meetings was that we contact people from places such as the Cherry Creek Arts Fair and other festivals to ask if they would be interested in addressing the group. Other suggestions were for demos on paint and lacquer, upholstery, chip carving, advanced finishing, a visit to Colorado Tree and Shrub and a Member/Dealer based Jigs, Gizmos and Thingies demo. Bill showed us the citation he was presented by the Jefferson County Sheriffs Dept. The plaque will be on display at Paxton Lumber and later at Rockler. Bill also announced he had bought a wooden train and thinks the guild could build this for it's toys program.

Please open up your hearts and join Bill, myself and the other volunteers in making this a better Christmas for more children. The feeling you will have on Christmas knowing there is a child with a toy that you helped make cannot be described with words. To these children, knowing someone cared enough to make a toy may change their life. We never know what effect a small act of kindness may have on a child's life.
