## Saw Blades and Sandpaper:

### To be sharp and abrasive.

The subject matter for the last meeting of the Guild may seem, well... boring. This was definitely not the case when Randy Childers from Childers Sharpening Service spoke to our small group of folks who braved the snowstorm to come to the October Guild meeting.

Randy shared stories about the business in which he has worked all of his life. His Father, Robert, started Childers Sharpening Service after responding to an ad in Popular mechanics magazine in the 1960's about starting your own sharpening business. And as they say the rest is history. There is no doubt that Randy has an impressive knowledge about blades and the sharpening of them. He shared much about the properties of a good saw blade and how they must be "pre-stretched" so to speak so that during operation they remain the same shape and operate properly. He talked about the types of metals that are used to make saw blades from the highest quality to the throw away ones. He also covered tooth shapes and angles and a fascinating view about blade speeds that made most of us a lot smarter about how fast we run our saws.

Randy also shared much about sandpaper: History, how it is made and the different qualities and uses of the different types. Did you know that there is actually sandpaper made from cubic zirconia? (That is the purple or green sanding belts.)

Some rules of thumb that I wrote down:

- The Magic sandpaper number is 150 grit
- Above 150 grit should be used for the finishing of the wood. Good sandpaper for this is Silicon Carbide.
- Below 150 grit is used for material removal. Good sandpaper for this is Aluminum Oxide.

Bottom line is Randy was very Gracious to come and speak to us and did an excellent and interesting talk for us that evening. He definitely knows his business and will sharpen our blades for us to the best quality available. We all probably have a dull blade on something. Childers can sharpen it for us.


