November Meeting

Jack Egan Gave us a very good introduction to the methods of lumber grading that are used throughout the industry. Production furniture and cabinet makers use these standards to guide them in purchasing truckloads or bunks of lumber that will give them the most yield for their dollar. Lumber grading rules are changed as the quantity and guality of a specific lumber changes due to availability.

The normal craftsman usually does not buy in quantities large enough to be concerned about lumber grade other than to know when they are being sold inferior goods. Even then, most of us do not understand the grading system enough to accurately judge a board.

I have found it best to trade with a reputable dealer and trust their judgement on what I need for a project. When building a special project, using solid lumber, you are well advised to use a dealr who will allow you to select enough boards where needed. Selecting enough boards for the top and purchasing a less expensive grade for railes, stiles or glued up panels might be a better choice.

Paxtons showroom allows woodworkers an opportunity to selecting wood for your project. Specialty lumber dealers accept special orders for unique boards. These boards are usually sold by the peice and are priced based upon burl, bird's-eye, curl or flash.

It has been said, "A woodworker is soeone who takes \$20,000 worth of tools, \$500 worht of lumber, and builds a \$300 table." As you can see, lumber is the least expensive item. My best advice, "Buy from someone you trust and can inspect the lumber before you take it home." Next month I will talk about free or salvaged lumber.
