Web Site Tutorial

I Can't Remember My Password

You can have your password emailed to you when you have forgotten it. Just click on the "LOST PASSWORD?" link below the LOGIN button and enter your info from there. It will then send you your password in an e-mail within minutes. You will need to know your USERNAME and the E-MAIL you have registered with the Guild.

You can change your USERNAME AND/OR your PASSWORD after you login if you would prefer something more familiar.

After you login, click on the YOUR PROFILE link on the right MEMBERS ONLY menu. Here you will see a blank image with a silhouette of a person and your info to the right of it. Just above the image there is an EDIT button. Place the mouse cursor over that and you will see two options: UPDATE YOUR PROFILE and UPDATE YOUR IMAGE. Click on UPDATE YOUR PROFILE and you will see a screen with areas to change your password and add or change any other info may want to. If you want to add even more information about yourself, click on the TAB that says ADDITIONAL INFO. Click on the UPDATE button at the bottom when you are finished to save the information. Remember that no one but other members can see your information, and even they can only see a limited amount of it, so feel free to add what you want.

If you want to add an image of yourself, just click on the UPDATE YOUR IMAGE from that same EDIT button.

Green Wood Mailing List

I have made a new contact recently with a man who has a tree removal service. He recently cut down a very large maple tree and was looking for some people to take it away for firewood. I was shocked at the idea of BURNING good Maple so I spoke with him and let you all know that some green Maple was available. He has agreed to let me know when he has more large trees to remove and I will pass on this information to anyone who is interested. I have started an E-MAIL ONLY notification list for those who would like to help salvage this wood before it goes to complete waste. I am sorry that this has to be an e-mail only list, but most of the notification at this point is time sensitive and I do not have the free time to put out a mail alert quickly enough. If this changes in the future I will let everyone know.

I would also like to think about putting together a committee which would work out details on green wood recovery and what/how we can deal with a large amount of trees that are cut down and hauled away for firewood, or worse yet, trash.

In the coming months I hope to have a series of articles on how to use Green Wood. From working with the fresh wood, still green to how it should be cut and dried and stacked for best use later. If you have any expertise with any of these areas I would love to talk with you or have you write an article on the subject.
