My favorite tip was the use of inlay over the top of a joint to hide an imperfection and make the project look that much nicer.



Tilea americana:

The genus name, Tilea is from the Greek, ptilon, meaning wing, because of the bract of flower clusters. The species name, americana, means it is from America.

Common Names:

American Basswood, American Linden, Lime Tree, Bee Tree, Linn, White Wood, Black Lime, Yellow Basswood, Wickup

Did Ya Know?

Iroquois Indians would strike the tree with a glancing blow from a hatchet and use the curved piece of sap wood that flaked off to make ceremonial masks.

In Lithuania, captive bees are fed Basswood flowers to make honey and it sells for 3 times the cost of regular honey. Linden honey is a delicacy.

Has a distinctive, wet and musty odor when cut.

Remember when hardware stores and other businesses gave away free yard sticks with their advertising on it? They were made from Basswood.

Just The Facts...

The specific gravity is .38 or 26 lbs per cubic foot.


The tree grows to a height of 65-100 feet with a maximum diameter of four feet.

It is tasteless and is used to make food containers. Also used for pattern making, picture framing, piano keys, boxes and crates, and veneers and plywood.

Ventriloquist dummy heads are Basswood.

It grows mainly in the Great Lakes region and the N. East.

It is a favorite of carvers because of its tight, white grain.



Growing from bottom up. Large pores are evenly distributed on the end grain. It's called "diffuse porous" Horizontal dark line is a Growth Ring. Vertical is a Ray
