

July Presentation Pat Morrow

At the July meeting Pat Morrow of Evergreen provided a much different approach to how you put the creative sparkle into your woodworking projects. Her background as a producer of corporate presentations

and student of art has led her to develop a more creative approach to making furniture. As she explained her basic sketch on a normal sized piece of paper and how that initial doodle is combined with an in depth conversation with the customer to begin to bring to life an original furniture design was most helpful to many of us. Her creations span a far more creative range than almost any other woodworker that I have come across. The use of curved surfaces, carving, and texture provides ways to enliven and project the customer's personal taste into a piece. When asked by a customer

to make a piece that simply does not fit well with a particular space in which it is to be placed; she carefully works them away from a certain sale and into the



process of a special design that fits the space and tastes of that customer. Many of us are asked to build something for a person that we know does not fit into a space or design motif of the area in which it is to be installed. It is hard for many of us to turn down the work or to do the effort necessary to convince the customer that something other than what they have asked would work better.

Pat's slide show of her furniture and the work of others gave us a lot of creative ideas and moved many of us out of the rut of same old stuff that we have been working on for so long. It is important that we get a shot of creative stimulation from time to time to keep us from falling back into old design habits. She certainly provided a new vision whereby you can create objects that speak more personally to the tastes of the customer. It was a most enjoyable lecture and I certainly appreciated her effort to share with us her design methods.

2009 Elections

- Pieces need to be picked up no later than Sept. 15th (CWG monthly meeting)
- Pieces will be judged in 3 classes:

Beginner / Student - Participant has recently discovered the wonderful world of woodworking

Intermediate - Participant has been working with wood for some time, but has not received an award in any contest

Advanced / Professional - Participant has been doing woodworking for some time and / or does woodworking as a profession

Participants will be allowed to categorize themselves based strictly on the honor system

Business cards will be allowed to be left on or around your piece

November 20-22


