"promote the environmentally appropriate, socially beneficial and economically viable management of the world's forests through standards development and certification."

The FSC consists of environmental and social groups, timber trade and forestry professions, indigenous people's organizations, responsible corporations, and community forestry groups. Many environmental organizations and leading American corporations are supporting FSC. The idea is to be able to purchase woods that we know are sustainably harvested.

FSC governance is based upon participation, democracy and equity. The FSC is striving to establish a market-based certification program, with third-party verification, that will assure the availability of sustainable forestry products. The certification program results in the labeling of forestry products so that the consumer knows whether the product is sustainably produced.

82 countries are participating. The FSC headquarters are located in Minnesota. Go to www.fsc.org for more information.




Aurora Kids Spree
