Guild Member's Shop Tour!

On Saturday, March 19th, we are offering a tour of four member's shops. These vary from large dedicated buildings, to a basement shop and small garage shop. Maps and a signup list will be available at the March Guild meeting. This tour will be in the extreme southeath area (Parker and Elizabeth). Come along and get ideas for your shop! We will meet in the Sprouts parking lot on the cormer of Lincoln and Parker at 8:30 and carpool from there.

SketchUp Class for Woodworkers!

This is the class you've been waiting for. A full 6 hours of classroom hands on training in the use of SketchUp. SketchUp is a free, easy to use and powerful 3D design and modeling program by Google. SketchUp can be downloaded at SketchUp.google.com. This class will be tailored specially for us woodworkers.

The class will be held on Saturday, April 30th in a computer lab at Front Range Community College-Boulder campus in Longmont, CO. Each attendee will have the full hands-on use of a computer. The class is being taught by Steve Dapkus (who is also a woodworker) on Google's SketchUp team. The plan is to introduce you to the capabilities of SketchUp and to actually work on the design of woodworking projects.

Here is a description of what will be covered:

Morning: The basics about making shapes, manipulating them, and extruding in 3D space

Afternoon:

- 1) A small bench with a few important joints (dovetails and mortise/tenon).
 - 2) A basic cabinet (basically how to make a box).
- 3) A shop table. One that could be tailored for specific uses, like an outfeed table or a router table. (This one may be optional due to time).

Here are the details:

When: April 30, 2011 from 9:00-4:00 (1 hour break for lunch)

Where: Front Range Community College, Room 1502, Miller Drive, Longmont, CO.

Cost: \$50.00 for CWG members and \$75.00 for non members (includes CWG membership for 2011).

Seating is limited! If you are interested in this class, we must receive a commitment and full payment by April 1st. We will be passing out flyers with complete details at our meeting in March. To whet your appetite, a quick demo of SketchUp will be provided at the March Guild meeting.

February Presentation

The February presentation was given by Henry Smith, a woodworker from Longmont. After he and his wife Charlie moved to Colorado, Henry told us how they started their jewelry box business (which both he and his wife work together on) and shared with us some of the problems he had when he started.

One of his biggest problems was burning the wood when he was making bevel cuts in woods like cherry. He spoke to his table saw blade manufacturer who suggested he raise the blade to the full height when making the cuts. This stopped the burning.

Other problems are avoided because Henry has developed a very specific and well documented work flow for each of his designs. He has written down step by step directions and measurements for each piece and uses them to reduce variability in his production. He has also developed jigs that help him with certain steps, such as adding the tiny biscuits he uses to reinforce his mitered corners.

He also shared that when finishing his boxes he uses up to 2000 grit silicon carbide paper which he

lightly sands in only one direction, and he finishes by applying five coats of lacquer.

The Jewelry boxes that the Smith's produce feature veneer tops and velvet interiors that Charlie creates. They alway use 1/2 inch MDF as the substrate for the veneer work, and have found that this is stiff enough that they do not need to veneer both sides to avoid warping.



After starting out by selling at craft shows, the Smith's now sell mainly through galleries, and online. To prevent issues with the Gallery owners, they make sure that their online prices are never lower than the Gallery prices.

Lakewood Gallery Showing

The City of Lakewood Cultural Center has offered to host a display of work from members of our Guild! They host ongoing and rotating exhibits throughout the year. They have offered the Guild a nearly 750 square foot gallery to display a variety of work done by our membership. The gallery includes both floor space for furniture and pedestals with or without plexi covers to accommodate and secure the smaller items. The Center also provides printed brochures discussing the pieces displayed and the woodworkers doing them. In addition, the brochure will include pictures of the process involved in making the item displayed as well as a short biography of the woodworker. They encourage the items be made available for sale although this is not mandatory. A percentage of the sale is kept by the Gallery as a way to help cover costs.

This is a very exciting opportunity for the Guild! If you have wanted to sell your work this is an excellent starting point. If you already sell your work it is yet another venue. If you have no interest in selling your work you can still display your work as 'not for sale' (NFS) and represent the varied interests and talents of the woodworkers of our Guild. Please don't be shy!

If you have an interest in getting involved in this incredible opportunity, please let me know as soon as possible (there will also be a sign up sheet at the March meeting). The display of our work is set for later in the year probably sometime in October or November. The lead time will allow us the time we need to coordinate with the Gallery and for you to create your pieces. We need information about size/type of piece or pieces you are interested in having displayed. If you are in the midst of creating something or have been thinking about that special piece and it is not yet finished, please let me know. There's plenty of time to create your project and have it finished in time to display.

Members, in the "Member Home" area, have access to member-only information such as the availability of special sales and commissions.
