Chris having taken three sequential marquetry classes at Red Rocks has developed an adept hand. Like any marquetry project the woods used are many as the artist works to create the picture. Curt Vogt took home the winner's gift card with his collection of Christmas ornaments. Curt used different wood pairings for each ornament. One was maple and bocote, and Curt used the opportunity to explain the difference in his choice of finishes. He used shellac on the

rosewood portion of the ornaments because an oil-based varnish would take months to dry properly.

Thank you to Chris and Curt for bringing in your projects. Remember to bring in your projects next month and show people what you've been doing. You might even walk away with a bit of spending money.
