Chris Connor is not your usual woodworker - he builds bikes. Not just a model of a bike, but a rideable, durable as well as artistic bike. His company, Connor Wood Bicycles, is located in Denver and he builds several models of bikes, from cruisers to mountain bikes. He uses steam bent ash and walnut to fashion his creations, with some parts laminated with Kevlar for strength and durability. Chris will be bringing a couple of his bikes as well as some of the jigs he uses to fashion the various parts. Please join us to learn about a facet of wood fabrication that you probably have not tried.
