## ***Show And Tell***

The first show and tell item was from none other than our fearless leader, Cary Goltermann. He brought in a variable Box Joint Jig he made from plans found in Woodsmith Magazine. It was made out of plywood, MDF and maple with an aluminum T-Slot where the customizable pins are secured.

Cal Noguchi brought in a stunning clock based on the shape of a Torii Gate. He described working over 2 weeks designing and sketching out the project. By time it was done, the clock looked nothing like what he had envisioned. Woods used include walnut, cherry, maple, oak, and some ambrosia maple he won in the CWG raffle a while back. Those of you surfing Lumber Jocks might have seen this clock posted on June 3rd, he received a coveted Daily Top Three award! His work impressed the guild as well... his Torii Clock was voted the top show and tell item for the June meeting.

Curt Vogt brought four new magic wands he turned on the lathe. He described how he has started experimenting with custom color tinting pore filler. In addition to traditional coloring to fill the grain in mahogany, he showed a red oak wand with brilliant blue grain color.

Ted Smathers was kind enough to share a very cool Civil War Officer's Chair he made from quarter sawn white oak. He followed the plans from the August 2012 Woodworker's Journal to make two matching chairs. The project was quite involved and even included some metalwork to form the steel rivets. He demonstrated for us how the key to the whole folding chair's operation are the cloth seats his wife sewed for the chairs.

Cliff Farris brought in a custom walking cane he crafted from curly maple. He described the process he used to shape the handle to be comfortable and the proper way to determine the length for a cane. The curly maple was finished with shellac and the cane's fittings were of brass.

This month we profile Charlie's 2nd Hand Store, a business that sells used tools. Charlie's was founded in Pueblo, Colorado in 1928 by Charlie Rosenblatt, an immigrant cobbler from Romania. In 1946 the business moved to its present Larimer Street location and is now operated by Steve, a third generation Rosenblatt.

Steve explained that Charlie's offers used tools for many trades men and women, including, but not limited to those in automotive, electrical, plumbing, woodworking, stone/tile and lawn/garden. His customers are an eclectic group across many disciplines and frequently find real bargains at Charlie's. A significant portion of Charlie's customers are woodworkers and Charlie's will frequently have some of the larger woodworking power tools in inventory. If they don't have what you are seeking, keep checking since they are constantly acquiring new items.

With 3 employees, Steve strives to obtain and carry only the highest quality tools obtainable. The biggest challenge for the business is keeping up with the demand for quality tools. Steve and his staff are constantly looking for new purchase opportunities. They will frequently receive calls from businesses that are closing and wish to sell tools or from a widow left with tools from the shop of her recently passed spouse. In fact, Steve offers a service to assist such widows in inventorying and pricing such tools. If the widow sells the tools to Charlie's, then he waives his service fee.

Charlie's website, [www.usedtoolsplus.com](http://www.usedtoolsplus.com) has given them visibility around the world. Through eBay and their website, they have been sending tools around the world since 2007.
