worker Cal Noguchi. Cal went through and explained how he did the roof of his Tori Gate Clock (not Nori Gate as I stated in the newsletter and on the web). Cal's clock was the win-



ning entry, by something of a landslide, in the June show and tell. The roof was shaped using a router sled riding on a curved jig. It's a very simple and powerful technique. July Show & Tell

The July Show and Tell was unique with a good mix of projects and two winners. The display was kicked off by the ever energetic President, Cary Goltermann. Cary brought in a pair of marking knives that he had made. Having been inspired by a fellow member, Cary used some old hacksaw blades and mahogany to craft his own marking knives. Cary turned his handles and blade covers so that they made a perfect friction fit.

Curt Vogt brought in a slew of items. First was a white oak bowl Curt made for the Lakewood Empty Bowls event. Next was a commissioned finial Curt made to repair a damaged front door. The last piece was a bowl that Curt had turned out of bass wood per the request of a carver. The bowl was turned with the intent to be carved and painted to look like a Navajo style pot. Interestingly, Curt found that bass is very stable wood as he rough turned the bowl and finished it a week later and the form was essentially unchanged.

Kevin Loyd (me) brought in a pair of tools he made as a thank you for a fellow member. The set consisted of a marking knife and cutting gauge similar to the ones I made and use in my shop. The difference was these were made of an odd wood several agreed was a bocote that was like a birds-eye maple. The blades in both were made from old hacksaw blades that had been ground and then hardened and tempered.

Travis Brown, President Emeritus, brought in a bowl that he had made from the root ball of an old pine tree from his yard. Travis did provide insight into a few important things. First, the power carving tool that resembles a chainsaw bit on the business end of an angle grinder is not for the faint of heart. The second point was that a piece of wood that seasoned outside for three years can still have all of its sap ready to coat everything it touches. Also, power carving requires good respiration safety gear.

There was a tie for the winners of the night. One of the winners was

Jim Ruby with his walking cane that was carved to look like a panel saw. Jim's carving skills shown through with the handle looking like a classic beautifully carved saw handle and to add to the effect Jim used some old saw nuts and a blade made of maple running the length of the cane.

The other winner of the night was a model of an old delivery truck that John Husner had made. The project was designed to use the stock toy parts from Rockler with the balance being flat pieces cut with his laser machine. John also attached an old post office box door to the back of the truck to make it into a coin bank.

Thank you to everyone that brought in a project to share with the guild. It is always good to see what the rest of the group is working on so bring you work.
