That's all for now.



# About Wood

For this month, January 2015, **Black Walnut** is our focus. As mentioned last month, each month will feature a wood, usually one in common use, and the column will describe the wood's characteristics.

In this second edition of the column, one of the characteristics, the Modulus of Elasticity (MOE) is defined. In future columns, the other characteristics will be defined.

In the simplest terms, the modulus of elasticity (MOE) measures a wood's stiffness, and is a good overall indicator of its strength. Technically it's a measurement of the ratio of stress placed upon the wood compared to the strain (deformation) that the wood exhibits along its length. MOE is expressed in pounds-force per square inch (lb /in<sup>2</sup>) or gigapas-cals (GPa). This number is given for wood that has been dried to a 12% moisture content, unless otherwise noted.

In practical terms, the number itself isn't all that meaningful, but it becomes useful to use in comparison with other woods. For instance, Hickory is known to have excellent strength properties among domestic species in the US, and has a MOE of 2,160,000 lb./in<sup>2</sup>

(14.90 GPa). In comparison, Red Oak is another well-known wood used in cabinetry and furniture, and has a MOE of 1,820,000 lb /in<sup>2</sup> (12.50 GPa)

#### **Black Walnut**

There are over a dozen species of walnut, including Butternut (in the same family). One of the most common walnuts in North America is **Black Walnut**. The scientific name is juglans nigra. **Black Walnut** is commercially harvested in North America (especially in eastern US) and is widely available. Here is a summary of the characteristics of **Black Walnut**:

Specific Gravity (Basic; 12% moisture content): 0.51: 0.61 Modulus of Rupture: 14,600 lb  $/in^2$ Modulus of Elasticity: 1,680,000 lb /in<sup>2</sup> Crush Strength: 7,580 lb /in<sup>2</sup> Janka Hardness: 1,010 lb Shrinkage: Radial, 5.5%; Tangential, 7.8%; Volumetric, 12.8%; T/R Ratio, 14 Heartwood Appearance: Medium to dark brown Sapwood Appearance: pale yellow-gray to nearlv white Texture: Usually straight grain, medium texture Stability: High Relative Strength: fairly low (14-18.9) Decay Resistance: High; very durable; susceptible to insect attack Workability: can be worked with hand and machine tools; good for nail and screw holding; glues and finishes well Odor: faint, mild odor Toxicity: Yes, sensitizer Potency: Moderate Toxicity Source: Wood, Dust Reaction: eye and skin irritation Sustainability: Not listed as threatened Uses: furniture, cabinetry, gunstocks, interior paneling, millwork, veneer, doors, flooring, turnings Typical Cost: \$4-10/bd ft.
