Membership



Presentation

At the November meeting we were treated to a visit by Herb Buffin, an early 1900's cabinetmaker from East Aurora, NY. Herb was recruited by Albert Hubbard the founder of the Roycroft campus. Herb works for him but took the train out here to visit us and tell us about cabinet making in the early 1900's. On the Roycroft campus there is a building for the cabinet makers, several stories tall. Herb is a supervisor. As Herb explained it most of the furniture they make is from locally grown white oak, some of it is from mahogany. The oak is milled quartersawn and this produces beautiful figure with ravs that have become a standard in Roycoft furniture. The furniture itself is simple and heavy. Each piece is made by one cabinetmaker from beginning to end and every cabinet maker can make every piece. A small table is listed in the 1901 catalogue for \$8 in white Oak and \$10 if you want mahogany. As a supervisor Herb earns \$15 a week, a regular cabinet maker earns \$9 a week. They work 5 days and ¹/₂ day on Saturday. Sometimes on their days off they make furniture for themselves, go for hikes, canoe on the creek or play in the band. In addition to the woodworkers there are other artisans on campus including those who make jewelry, paper, pottery, art tiles, prints, fabric, leather, lamps and other crafts. The Roycrofters are still an active guild today with artisans creating in the same way they did back in Herb Buffin's day.

About Wood Terminology—Dec 2015

In October this column presented information about terminology we use in our woodworking. Though the column will continue to cover the woods we use, for this month, here are a few more terms.

Air-dried lumber: Lumber that was dried, usually outside, to equilibrium moisture content with the air it was exposed to. Any lumber below 30% MC is classified as air dried. Construction grade is around 19% MC. Moisture content of air-dried wood fiber depends on length of drying period, relative humidity, and temperature. It's also referred to as air seasoned.

Bark Pocket: An opening between annual growth rings that contains bark. Bark pockets appear as dark streaks on radial surfaces and as rounded areas on tangential surfaces.

Birds-eye figure: A figure composed of many small "BB" size rounded areas, resembling a bird's eye. The figuring is most common on plain and rotary sawn lumber and is generally found on maple, along with a few other species.

Bolt: A short round section of a log.

Bookmatch: A term in sawing or veneering, where successive pieces of boards or veneer, from a flitch or a log, are arranged side by side. A properly done bookmatch will resemble a mirror image of the opposite side. Also known as butterflied, mirrors, and sisters.

Bow: A defective piece of lumber that has warped along its length.

Cambium: The live, actively growing layer of a tree. The cambium is one cell thick and resides between the phloem and sapwood. It repeatedly divides itself to form new wood which causes the tree to expand and grow. It is the layer that becomes either bark or wood and lays dormant during winter.

Clear (CLR): A board which is free from defects. A term including the higher grades of lumber sound, relatively free of blemishes.

Crook: A lumber defect where an edgewise warp effects the straightness of the board.

Crotch Grain: A figure produced by cutting cen-

trally through a tree crotch in the common plane of both branches.

Cup: A defect in the lumber where the face of the board warps up like the letter "U".

Milling: Rough-cut and surfaced lumber are manufactured to full standard thickness. All milled lumber is sold on a rough board foot basis. Example: 4/4 surfaced lumber milled to ³/₄" is measured based on a full inch thickness.

Twist: Warping in lumber where the ends twist in opposite directions.

Warp: A defect in lumber characterized by bending in one or more directions; any deviation of the face or edge of a board from flatness, or any edge that is not at right angles to the adjacent face or edge; the most common forms of warp are bow, crook, cup, and twist.
