The Denver Woodworking Company (www.denverwoodworking.com) began operations in February 1978. Charlie White started the company after a nine-year woodworking initiation making sofa frames. His company began small, but has now grown to 6 employees and 12,000 square feet of space on South Bannock Street just north of Evans. Denver Woodworking is a job shop excelling in specialty commercial production. Most of their work is for the commercial establishment where jobs range from one-off custom pieces to production runs of 1,000 or more. Charlie remembers one job that required the delivery of 120,000 pieces. Examples of Denver Woodworking Company's jobs include a conference table, custom railing, finely machined detail, and the "digital" dragon.

Charlie spends much of his time talking to customers and preparing proposals for their work. He has simplified and streamline the proposal process to make it less onerous and more effective. A big challenge for the company is keeping up with and meeting fire and OSHA regulations. He has continued to expand and modernize his business over the years. Denver Woodworking has a large-scale CNC router and has plans to increase its CNC capability with a four-axis machine.

Charlie particularly likes to interact with customers as his company works to define and meet their needs. He fondly remembers a time when a person called to order a table. As a point of clarification Charlie asked, "how long would you like to have the legs". The customer replied, "long enough to reach the floor". As we all know, good communication is critical in the interaction between the customer and the worker. Frequently the craftsman is required to educate and guide the customer.

About Wood

In this month, January 2017, we consider **Butternut**. **Butternut** (**Juglans cinerea**), is a small to medium size tree from the family Juglandaceae, the walnut family.

Recall that in previous columns, we have defined the Modulus of Rupture (MOR), the Modulus of Elasticity (MOE), Crush Strength, and Janka Hardness. We will continue to use those terms. Most of the other terms are generally well understood and will not be defined further. If you have questions about other terms or questions about a specific wood, contact

Butternut

Here is a summary of the characteristics of **Butternut**:

Distribution: Southeastern Canada, Northeastern United States, West to the Dakotas, South to northern Arkansas, Mississippi, and Alabama Tree size: 65-100 ft. (20-30 m) tall; 2-3 ft. (0.6-1.0 m) trunk diameter Average Dried Weight: 27 lbs/ft3 (435 kg/m3) Specific Gravity: (Basic, 12% MC): .36, .43 Modulus of Rupture (MOR): $8,100 \text{ lb}/\text{in}^2$ (55.9) MPa) Modulus of Elasticity (MOE): 1,180,000 lb_f/in² (8.14 GPa) Crush Strength: $5,110 \text{ lb}_{\text{f}}/\text{in}^2$ (35.2 MPa) Janka Hardness: $490 \text{ lb}_{f}(2, 180 \text{ N})$ Shrinkage: Radial, 3.4%; Tangential, 6.4%; Volumetric, 10.6%; T/R Ratio, 1.9 Heartwood Appearance: light to medium tan, sometimes with a reddish tint Sapwood Appearance: pale yellowish white and narrow Grain/Texture: typically straight grain with a medium to coarse texture; silky natural luster Stability: dimensionally stable after drying; easy to dry Relative strength: moderately weak in bending and end-wise compression Decay Resistance: subject to insect and fungus attack; durability below black walnut Workability: easily worked with hand or power tools; sharp cutting edges required due to the softness of the species; takes a rich, lustrous finish; glues, stains, and finishes well Odor: little or no scent or odor Toxicity: none; regular concerns for wood dust Potency: low Toxicity Source: wood dust Reaction: ordinary respiratory issues with dust Sustainability: supplies are limited and diminishing Uses: furniture, interior trim, carving, paneling, boat building; more valuable for its nut; sap can be used to make svrup Typical Cost: mid-range domestic hardwood Comments: sometimes called White Walnut or Oilnut; closely related to Black Walnut; Butternut is softer and lighter than Black Walnut
