### **About Wood**

Since 2015, this column has primarily focused on woods of North America (and mostly, but not exclusively, hardwoods). Since the first column, only five "exotic woods" have been covered. For 2019, the column will only cover exotic woods, especially those from Central and South America, Africa, and Southeast Asia/Oceania.

In this month, January 2019, we consider **Amboyna**. In most of the world, **Amboyna** is also known as **Narra** (Pterocarpus indicus). **Narra** is from the Fabaceae or Leguminosae, the legume family; the pea or pulse group. There are 70 or more species growing in the pan-tropical regions. Other names include New Guinea rosewood, Burma rosewood and Angsana. Some of the species are traded as padauk. **Amboyna** generally refers to the burl wood from any of the Pterocarpus species.

Recall that in previous columns, we have defined the Modulus of Rupture (MOR), the Modulus of Elasticity (MOE), Crush Strength, and Janka Hardness. We will continue to use those terms. Most of the other terms are generally well understood and will not be defined further. #### Narra (including Amboyna)

Here is a summary of the characteristics of **Narra**:



Distribution: Malaysia, Indonesia, and the Philippines with some throughout Southeast Asia and into Australia

Tree size: 65-100 ft (20-30 m) tall; 3-5 ft (1.0-1.5 m) trunk diameter

Average Dried Weight: 41 lbs/ft3 (655 kg/m3) Specific Gravity: (Basic, 12% MC): .54, .66

Modulus of Rupture (MOR): 13,970 lb<sub>f</sub>/in<sup>2</sup> (96.3 MPa) Modulus of Elasticity (MOE): 1,724,000 lb<sub>f</sub>/in<sup>2</sup> (11.89 GPa)

Crush Strength: 8,270 lb<sub>f</sub>/in<sup>2</sup> (57.0 MPa) Janka Hardness: 1,260 lb<sub>f</sub> (5,620 N)

Shrinkage: Radial, 2.8%; Tangential, 4.0%; Volumetric, 6.9%; T/R Ratio, 1.4

Appearance: heartwood from golden yellow to a reddish brown; sapwood is pale yellow; quarter sawn surfaces

display ribbon-stripe figure; the burl, known as Amboyna, is highly valued

Grain/Texture: usually interlocked and can be wavy; uneven medium to coarse texture and good natural luster

Stability: properly seasoned reported to be dimensionally stable

Relative strength: considered to be strong; similar to Teak

Decay Resistance: wood weathering characteristics and durable regarding decay resistance Workability: easy to work with hand and machine tools; moderate blunting effect on cutters; glues and finishes well

Odor: fragrant even in seasoned wood

Toxicity: reported as an irritant

Potency: moderate

Toxicity Source: wood dust

Reaction: skin and respiratory, including asthma-like symptoms Sustainability: on the vulnerable list because of over exploitation

Uses: veneer, furniture, cabinetry, boatbuilding, plywood, turning, musical instruments, carvings

Typical Cost: non-burl is moderately priced; high-grade **Amboyna** is one of the most expensive woods in the world

Comments: the resemblance between **Narra** and **Amboyna** is virtually unrecognizable though they come from the same tree


