Use of Solvents

Solvents are contained in many adhesives, paints, stains, dyes, and varnishes. If used improperly, they can damage eyes, burn skin, or cause other serious health problems.

1. Handle Liquid Solvents Safely

Do

- Read the instructions on each solvent container.
- Wear eye protection and gloves.
- Assure good cross-ventilation or wear a respirator.
- Limit the time you are exposed to harmful vapors.
- Wash hands with soap and water before eating or smoking.
- Store solvents away from heat or open flames.

Do Not

- Never pour used solvents into sinks or drains connected to a sewer system,
- Never smoke or use solvents around sparks or open flames,
- Do not wash your hands in dangerous solvents such as toluene.

2. <u>Use Solvent Based Adhesives Carefully</u>

Do

- Read the instructions on each adhesive container.
- Wear eye protection and rubber gloves.
- Maintain good cross ventilation when using contact cement, epoxy, CA glue. or mastic.
- Limit your exposure time to any vapors.
- Use denatured alcohol immediately to remove epoxy from skin and then wash with soap and water.

Do Not

• Never use solvent based adhesives near sparks or a flame.

3. Apply Solvent Based Finishes With Care

Do

- Read the instructions on each finish container.
- Maintain good cross ventilation when using solvent based paint, stains, dyes, or varnishes.
- Limit your exposure time to any vapors.
- Work outdoors or use a ventilated spray booth when spraying any finish.

Do Not

- Never spray finishes indoors without a ventilated spray booth.
- Never use solvent based finishes near sparks or a flame.

Jason's Shrink Pot is shown next, called a Shrink Pot as the main cylinder is turned from green wood. Then a snug fitting "bottom" is pressed in. The press fit becomes tight as the green wood cylinder dries out and shrinks. Pretty cool.

Meeting Presentations

August 2023 Meeting

On August 15th, 2023, George Vondriska presented via Zoom at our August meeting. He spoke on the topic of table saw techniques and demonstrated some cool things you can do with this tool. Many of you will know of his work with the Woodworkers Guild of America, which offers tremendous resources for developing woodworking skills. For our presentation, George reviewed how to use set-up blocks to cut perfect rabbets in two passes. He also showed how to cut non-ferrous metals, such as aluminum, on the table saw using 80 tooth blades. However, the highlight of the evening was the Q&A with this master woodworker on all aspects of the craft and the trade.

Education Corner - The Bargueño Desk

The Bargueño Desk is one of Golden Age Spain's most famous pieces of furniture. The style originated in a town near Toledo, Spain, about an hour southeast of Madrid. The desk was considered the most ornate furniture example of Spain's Golden Age (1550-1650). The first desks were made with Ebony, the wood for which furniture makers -or 'ebanistas'- receive their name in Spanish. We might compare the style of the desks to a much more baroque rendering of James Krenov's cabinets on a stand. The Ebanistas in Vargas devoted painstaking hours to constructing these elaborate works.

The main function of the Bargueño desk was to store documents and papers. Once removed from the stand, the chest was able to be packed and transported more easily. The number of drawers varied throughout the years. However, one usually sees horizontal sets of three or four drawers of different sizes and numbers of columns. Another variation can be seen in the stands. Some were basically table legs on which the Bargueño desk was placed. Others were a continuation of the drawers, turning the stand into a chest itself.


• Again, the Rockler catalog and the online flyer at Rockler.com both have some up to 25% sale and new items in addition to a long list of woodworking items. Check it out.
